CAMPUS Asia Seminar Series vol. 5
"Waseda Meets Global Leaders"



In April 2017, Campus Asia launched a new seminar series titled "Waseda Meets Global Leaders" to provide Campus Asia students and other Waseda-based students to meet and discuss with leaders who are tacking with various social issues in today's world. We have invited leaders from ILO, School for International Training, Harvard Kennedy School, and UNDP.

On December 5, we invited Mr. Siddharth Chatterjee and Ms. Ahunna Eziakonwa-Onochie from UNDP and held the 5th seminar welcoming 70 audiences at Ono Auditorium, Waseda Univ.

Both lecturers shared their experiences from childhood to current assignment as UNDP Resident Representative for Kenya and Ethiopia respectively and gave strong messages to young people who wish to work in the area of conflict resolution and social innovation.

At the Q&A session facilitated by Prof. Uesugi, so many good questions were raised from students.

I met Prof. Umemori for the first time in June 2017 when he came to Peking Univ. to interview me. It is unforgettable for me when Prof. Umemori asked "What kind of person do you want to be?" The question was simple but I shall spend my whole life to answer it. Prof. Umemori seemed satisfied and nodded his head.
