Professor Sun Hua is Executive Dean of Yuanpei College, Peking University. His research areas include People-to-People exchange and Cross-Culture communication, and he focus on Edgar Snow studies, the author of Red Star on China, when he got a Ph.D. degree in School of International Studies of PKU. He thinks that the CAMPUS Asia is to train and nurture Asian leaders of the next generation through the undergraduate joint program by three participating institutions from Japan, Korea, and China. This will help contribute to the harmonious development of East Asia and of the world. University today have an important responsibility to society to develop leaders with a strong desire to resolve conflicts ranging from large-scale international disputes to those at the local community level, and equipped with the necessary practical skills and strategies to do so. A quote below is his message to all CA students, which is what we need to do to make our society better.

"Why the CA Program is focused on A network of next-generation leaders from Japan, China, and Korea? I think it is important to use case studies to illustrate principles and to apply concepts to the real world, and solve practical problems. Young people are the vanguard of ideological emancipation, and your values represent the future direction of social development. We expect, with youth's unique vitality and creativity, by sharing knowledge and experiences from different disciplines and factors, the CA students will make active explorations of the progress of society in the issue of global administration."
