Campis Asia Social Innovation Forum at Peking University

Introduction

The Social Innovation Forum held at Peking University was such a fulfilling and unforgettable experience that it's hard to believe it's only three days. Day1: 4th July, 2025

Day2 : 5^{th} July, 2025

In the morning, we visited the Beijing Planning Exhibition Hall and the Olympic Tower as part of a field trip. The architectural models were elaborate and truly impressive. At the Olympic Tower, we learned about the history of the Olympics so far and enjoyed a 360degree view of beautiful Beijing cityscape from the observation deck.

In the afternoon, we attended two lectures on "Innovations for Inclusive Societies" and "War between the States". As with the lecture on the first day, both lectures provided valuable insights. We discussed how to build societies where no one is left behind and deepened our understanding of the mechanisms of war between states.

After dinner, I visited Shichahai with some of the participants, a beautiful area in Beijing famous for its lakes and historic alleyways. Walking through Shichahai felt like stepping into a whole new world.



Day3: 6th July, 2025

On this day, we visited the Drum Tower and Bell Tower as part of our field trip. Both towers gave us a deep sense of China's long history. Watching the actual moment the drum was played was fascinating, and I learned that these towers once played an important role in keeping and announcing the time to the public.

In the afternoon, each group prepared for presentations. My group discussed Aging issues in East Asia. Through sharing the current situations faced by each country, I was able to deepen my understanding of perspectives and backgrounds beyond Japan, which helped me think about the issue of aging from a broader point of view. Each group gave presentations on a wide range of issues, addressing not only aging issues but also topics such as education, disability, social issues, and migrant workers. Each presentation was very thought-provoking

and shared diverse and practical perspectives on social innovation.
